1. An Unforgettable Meeting: (Creating character descriptions)

* Find five of the words the author used to describe her eyes. Beside each one write the name of someone whose eyes can look that way.

2. A Timeline: (A way to organize information)

Group of three: scribe, illustrator, presenter. On pg. 43 Father Bernard said, "You will begin here." But you know Stephen's story really began with a visit from a stranger, while he was tending his sheep.

* Decide what important event(s) have happened to Stephen so far. (Record page number.)
